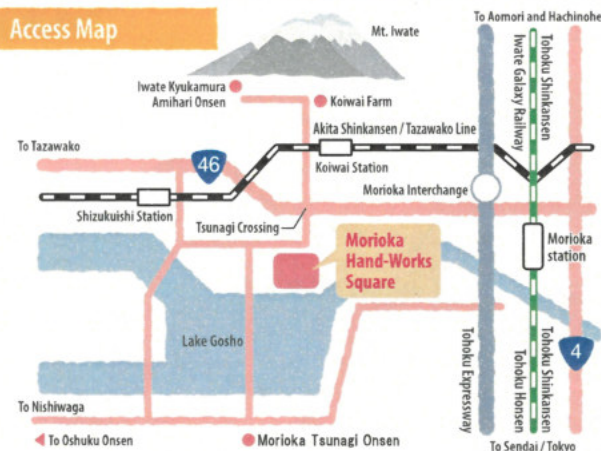

Traffic

Car

- From Morioka station, about 14km (about 25 minutes) on Route 46 toward Akita.
- From Morioka Interchange on the Tohoku Expressway, about 8km (about 10 minutes) on Route 46 toward Akita.

Bus

- From Morioka Station, take an Iwateken Kotsu bus bound for "Morioka Tsunagi Onsen". Get off at "Morioka Tezukurimura-mae". bus stop Time about 30 minutes

- About 5 minutes by car to Morioka Tsunagi Onsen
- About 20 minutes by car to Oshuku Onsen
- About 10 minutes by car to Koiwai Farm
- About 30 minutes by car to Morioka Castle Site Park

Parking

- Space for 10 large buses in front of the Promotion Center, 3 parking spaces for disabled people
- Parking Lot: 165 spaces for normal-sized vehicles

Morioka Handi-Works Square is composed of **three zones**, the **Morioka Local Industry Promotion Center**, **Handi-Works Workshops**, and **Nambu Magariya**.

The biggest highlights are the "Handi-Works Workshops." There are 14 centers teaching a total of 11 different industries, each with skilled artisans painstakingly continuing their crafts every day, and visitors can get a close look at the process of production. Also, the "Nambu Magariya" (Nambu Bent House), characteristic of the horse-breeding area Nambu, has become a dual facility hosting the Exhibition Room and the Souvenir Shop that sells local products and specialty items so that visitors can enjoy the charm of Morioka.

Handi-Works Workshop

At the "Handi-Works Workshops" zone, visitors can watch experienced artisans' traditional crafting techniques and the production methods of local dishes and sweets. There is also a classroom where visitors can receive instruction from the artisans and try making these crafts.

Nambu Magariya

This traditional residence from a horse-breeding area, called a Magariya, was relocated to the Handi-Works Square, and is said to have been originally built in the late Edo era. Various farming tools that were used during the Edo era are on display in the Magariya, allowing visitors to enjoy the feeling of having traveled back in time.
